A Report on

**“ONLINE COUNSELING FOR THE ACEDMICALLY WEAKER STUDENTS OF
FIRST YEAR B.E.”**

- 1. Title of Practice:** Online Counselling For the Academically Weaker Students of First Year B.E.
- 2. Objective of Practice:** To build the confidence of students to pursue higher education in the field of engineering and technology. Most of the students admitted in first year B.E. course belong to poor farmer's family and tribal families. These students are having inherent fear in their mind set about the English as language of instruction. To control the dropout rate of the students after first Sessional test, it becomes necessary to motivate students by visiting their home and interacting with their parents about importance of technical education. But due to Covid-19 Pandemic we have performed online counselling to academically weaker student.
- 3. The Content:** The faculty members and mentors communicated with parents regarding their availability at homes as most of them are working as labours in farms, private organisation and on MREGS run by the state government. Faculty members worked for extra hours for successful conduction of this activity for convincing the illiterate parents view of continuous improvement in academic performance of their wards is itself was big challenging. This needs hours together counselling session.
- 4. The Practice:** The group of faculty identified the students having poor academic performance which includes Sessional test poor performance, absenteeism in regular theory and practical classes etc. Plan of Online Counselling was chalked out by team of faculty members as per availability of parents at home in the morning session before and after working hours. The faculty members performed online counselling due to COVID-19 pandemic. Face to face conversation was done with parents in presence of their wards for maintaining complete transparency about the objective of this practice also photographs were captured during the discussion. The overall activity was carried out under the guidance of first year in charge and higher authority. This practice reflected uniqueness in terms of its execution at higher educational institutional imparting technical education for under graduate program. Most of the time availability of parents belonging to labour class and farmers' background is the major constraint; also, their education level has proved to be one of major limitations.
- 5. Evidence of Success:** After doing online counselling it was observed that about 90% of parents had agreed upon the facts about their wards. Student's attitude changes were also observed. These results in overall improvement of their academic performance and communication with their teacher mentors, it also helps to reduce



the communication barriers with their higher authorities. The students' involvement in various co-curricular activities is increased. Their stress and fear about technical subject was also found to be declining. The home sickness feeling was also observed to be diminishing as they feel their teachers and mentors are caring for them like family members.

- 6. Problems encountered and Resources Required:** Initially, we experienced resistance from the students in visiting their parents at home probably due to poor economic condition and availability of parents after taking into confidence they got ready to cooperate with us in executing this practice, also some of the faculty members faced some difficulties in participating this activity due to their family constraints. Afterwards, adjusted to work willingly to contribute for the success of this practice when experience the real life situation of the students from rural and socio economically backward region. Resources required includes provision of four wheeler to visit remote destination which is always being made available by our institution as and when required on priority basis. But in COvid-19 Pandemic situation, we didn't encounter any problem as we have performed online counselling to student.

“ESTABLISHMENT OF PLACEMENT ASSISTANCE CELL FOR PASS OUT STUDENTS”

1. Title of the Practice:

Establishment of Placement assistance cell for Pass out Students

2. Objective of the Practice:

- Organization of awareness programs for bridging the gap between industry and institution on latest industry trends.
- To make the students industry ready through various training program.
- To help the pass out students for placement assistance and extending the support.

3. The Context:

Some of the students could not placed in industry during the placement drive conducted by the institution. These students usually try to acquire placement at their own effort and get unsuccessful. To assist and help these students for placement, institute has established placement assistance cell for pass out students.

4. The Practice:

Institute is collecting the record from pass out students by continuous follow-up in the form of telephonic survey. This data base consist the information related to current status of the students about their employment. To extend the support help of Alumni association is taken for conduction of survey. Pass out students those are unemployed are called to the Institute and various placement opportunities are discussed with them. In certain cases these students are given the facility to attend the training to make them competent with recent industrial trends. Also they are given assistance with conduction of Mock Interviews by the Industry Experts, resume building sessions are conducted for regular final year students the pass out identified unemployed students are also assisted during this program. Job opportunities are provided to these pass out students with the help of relation established with the Industries.



5. Evidence of Success:

Many of the passed out students are benefitted out of this practice. Students got placed in various multinational companies and secured their jobs.

6. Problems Encountered and Resources Required:

Sometimes, it becomes difficult for finalizing the list of beneficiary of this scheme, help from respective Teacher Mentor is sought to confirm the employment status of the pass out students. Many of them shown least interest in getting training with their junior students. On the part of Placement assistance from institution point of view separate sessions are not possible to be organized for few in numbers of the pass out students.

7. Notes:

The satisfactory feedbacks received by the parents telephonically about employment of their wards are impossible to describe in words, which in turn satisfies the vision of the institution to provide education to the socioeconomically backward class of the society to make them employable and stood on their feet's.

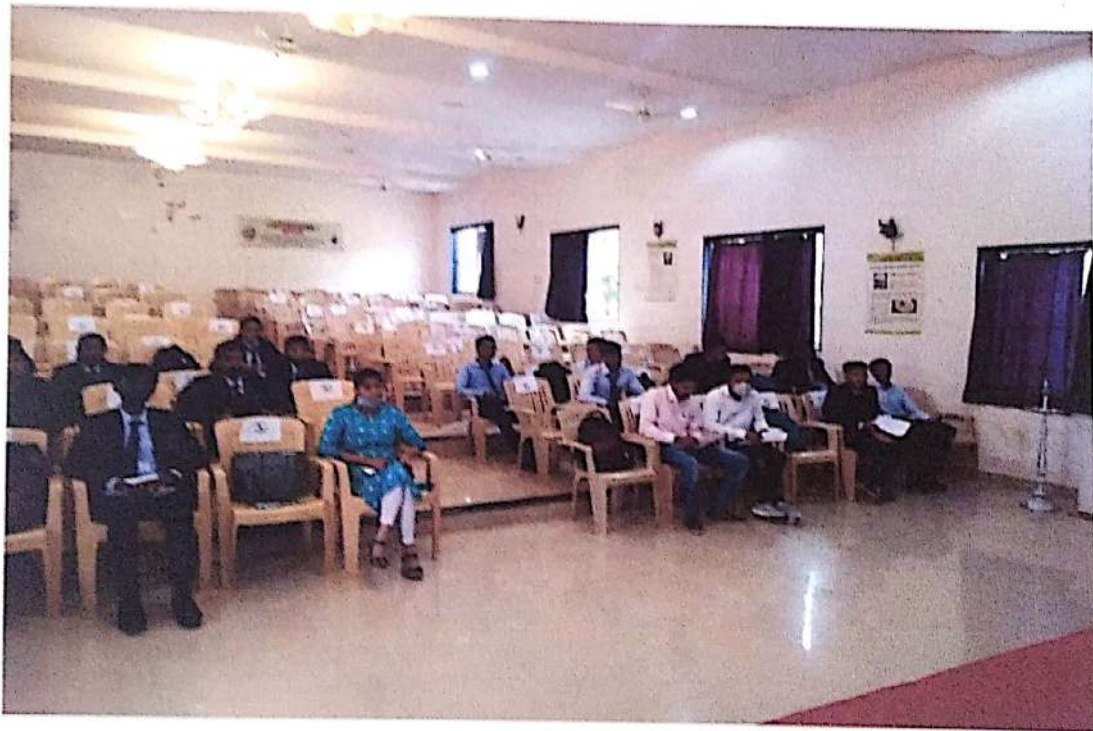



9. Program Outcomes:
